LIFE CYCLE

- Up to 49 - 57 days after mating, the mother gives birth to a litter of 4 - 12 pups.
- The pups are about the size of your fist. They are tiny, blind and helpless at birth.
- Then they grow into a kit when the male goes out to source food or stay to guard the den from predators such as polar bears. The female then does the opposite to what the male is doing. (that means if the male is guarding the house the female will go out to source food or that the other way around.)
- Then they grow into an adult when the male is called a dog and a female is called a vixen.
